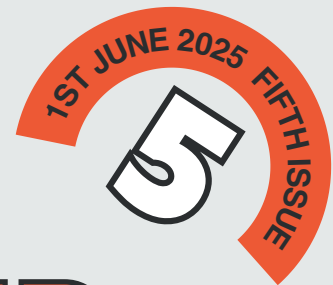

11. If there is sun and it rains at the same time, it means that an elephant is giving birth



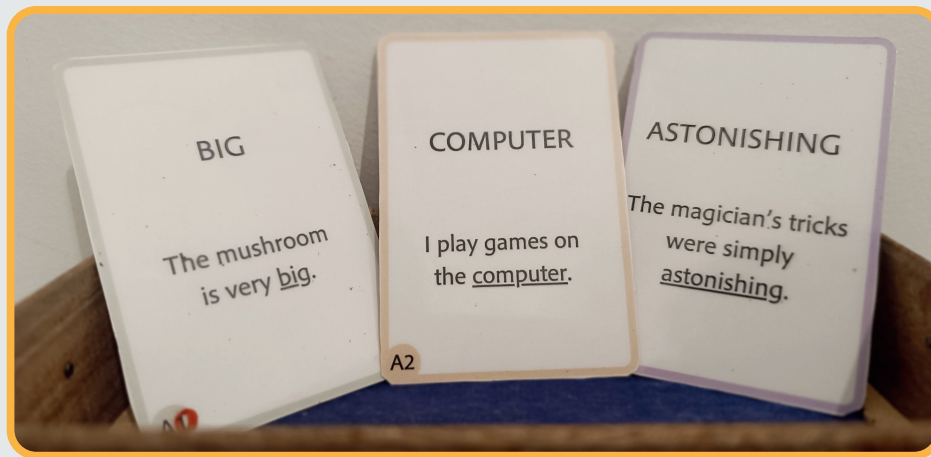

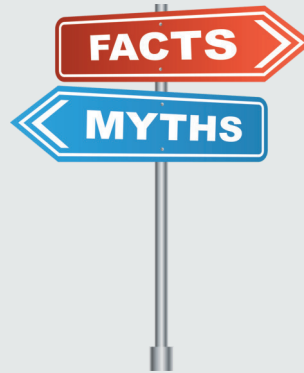

She is my biggest inspiration and always gives me strength."

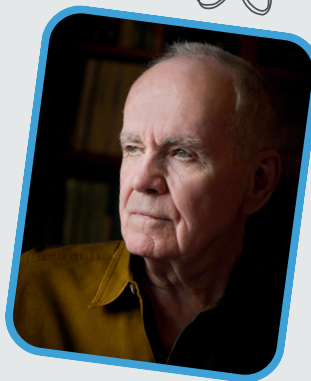


## Salim, our B2 student:

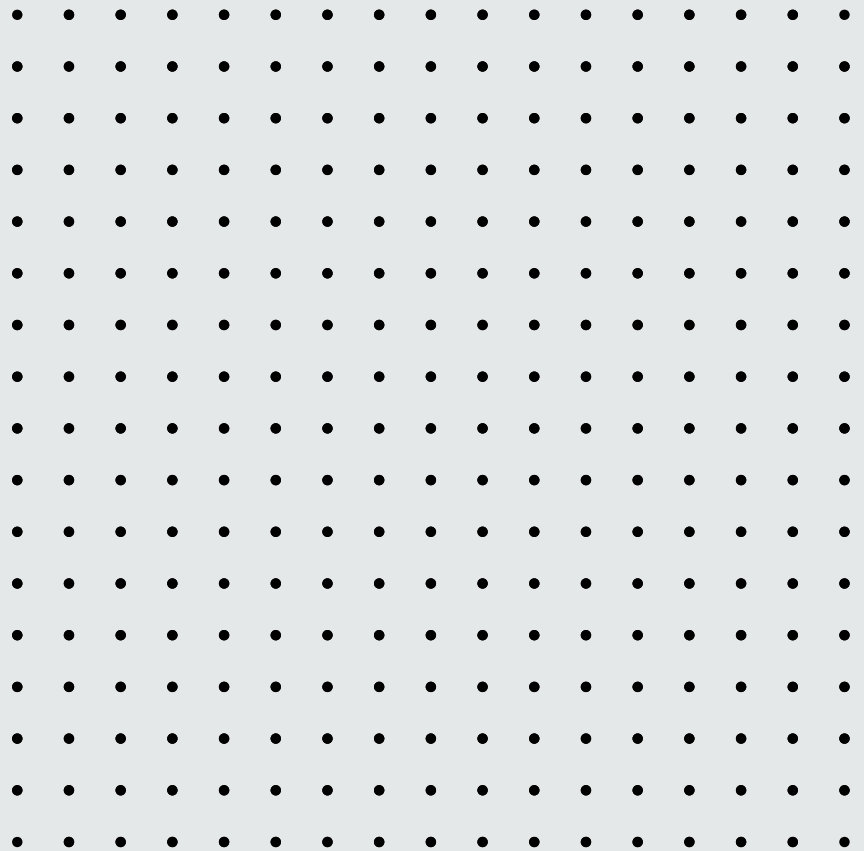


At this part of the magazine you can find mini games chosen to entertain the readers, our magazine is not only for you to learn but also have fun!

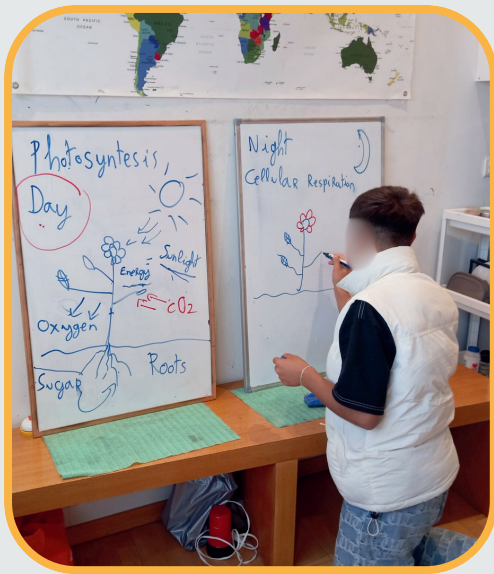
# EVENING CLASSES

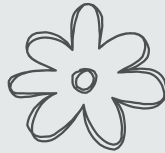
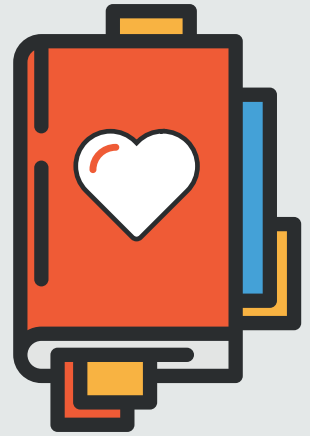

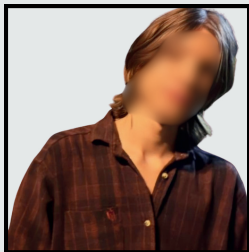
